PEC Showing

Here at Providence there are many showing opportunities that fit each rider's experience, goals, level of commitment, horse suitability, and budget. We host barn shows and attend "C" rated PSJ and BRHJA shows, and "B" shows. We have a qualified staff to help find an appropriate lease or purchase of a horse or pony for a successful partnership at these shows and can also lease our own academy horses. We offer an IEA team for middle and high school riders.

STONEHAVEN 's nationally acclaimed trainer and resident professional, Todd Wisegarver, offers his experience and expertise to the rider showing at A rated shows. Stonehaven offers comprehensive services from finding the right horse for each rider, to lessons and show preparation. Combine this with training and conditioning of the equine athlete, riders enjoy sound and well prepared horses, protection of their investment, and much success in the show ring.

Lesson Descriptions

Beginner I- Learn to safely approach, halter, and lead a horse, Learn to groom, tack, mount, and dismount, Introduction to riding aids, Learn correct riding position and balance exercises, Introduce walking and trotting, Introduce the concept of diagonals, Learn the two-point position and posting at the trot, Practice utilizing riding aids in steering exercises, Trail riding.

Beginner II - Know parts of the tack, Learn diagonals, Begin pole work, Learn to canter, Introduce sitting trot, Improve and strengthen two-point position, Improve use of all riding aids in steering and gait transitions, Trail riding.

Beginner III- Tacking independently, Increase strength and body position at walk, trot, and two-point, Introduction to no stirrup work at the walk and trot, Improve the use of all riding aids, Begin cantering individually, Introduction to leads, Develop ability and confidence in pole patterns, Introduction to x-rail jumping and stride counting.

Intermediate I- Work on transitions, Know leads, Expand the use of riding aids, including leg yielding, half halting, and leg-to-hand, Introduce collection and extension at the canter, Continue to work on x-rails and jumping small solids, Begin course work, Improve stride counting.

Intermediate II- Develop clear understanding and execution of circles, serpentines, and figure eights, Continue transition work, Develop leg-to-land and apply to course work, Improve counting, balance, position, and strength over fences, Jumping to 2'3".

Advanced- Continue position strengthening, Apply prior knowledge to longer jump heights, Master and execute flying lead changes, Consistent balance and rhythm in coursework, Master ability to alter stride length on the flat and in coursework, Utilize all aids to maximize responsiveness and ride ability. Individually tailored instruction for advancing equestrian based on riding goals in hunt seat, jumping, and equestrian disciplines.
